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Analyzing & Understanding Your Family's Results:

If you've kept a tally of how everyone voted, you'll gain interesting insight into how to plan the perfect curriculum for the perfect travel destination for your family. You'd find certain areas where everyone chose the same and other areas that may show polar opposites. All these are super insightful. Here's an example from my family of four.

0/4 or 4/0 Answers: These answers will help focus your planning to match your family's unique learning and travel style. Answers identify what's really important *if you had to choose*.

- 0/4 Sushi or Tacos? - **TACOS**
- 0/4 House sit with pets or or Airbnb? - **HOUSE SIT**
- 4/0 Hot Showers or Washing Machine - **HOT SHOWERS**
- 4/0 Photography or journaling - **PHOTOGRAPHY**
- 0/4 Tours as part of a larger group or just your family? - **JUST OUR FAMILY**
- 4/0 Theme Park or hike? - **HIKE**
- 0/4 Beach or Zoo? - **ZOO**
- 0/4 Desert or beach? - **BEACH**
- 0/4 New town every 3 days or 1 town every 2 weeks? - **ONE TOWN EVERY 2 WEEKS**
- 4/0 Snow ski or water ski? - **SNOW SKI**
- 4/0 Lots of tree or lots of ocean? - **TREES**

Analysis; Our family appreciates slow travel, the outdoors, animals, and apparently want to learn to snow ski!.

2/2 Answers: These answers will inspire ideas for quality time for 1 adult and child(ren) or how to create a surprise activity or destination. It's a great way to 'divide and conquer' when there are so many things to see and not enough time to do everything everyone wants to do together. Here's an example from our family:

- 2/2 Famous Inventor/Famous Writer
- 2/2 Travel the world on a shoestring/Stay in one country comfortably
- 2/2 Hot air balloon ride or boat ride
- 2/2 Legos/Rock climbing
- 2/2 Space museum/Naval museum
- 2/2 Fireworks/ Circus performance



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- 2/2 Skiing/Water park

Analysis: Our family would do well to divide and conquer (where possible) when it comes to some activities. Although many museums offer a plethora of choices/themes to cater to a variety of interests.

1 /3 or 3/1 Answers: These answers identify opportunity to create space in your travel plan. Is the introvert adult needing some time alone? Is someone ill or needing a recovery day? Does one adult need to spend a few hours working? These answers will help you build in experiences that can help meet those needs while still enjoying the day as much as possible. Here's an example for our family.

- 1 /3 Origami/Master of magic tricks - **MASTER OF MAGIC TRICKS**
- 3/1 Study an amazing Painter/ Study a brilliant mathematician - **PAINTER**
- 3/1 Visit a cave/Bungee Jump - **CAVE**
- 3/1 Art Museum/Lit. Or Author Museum - **ART**
- 3/1 Aquarium or Ferris Wheel city view - **AQUARIUM**

Analysis: if our family needs to give an adult a break, then doing a workshop, or hands on class may be a perfect way to explore and have fun together.
